

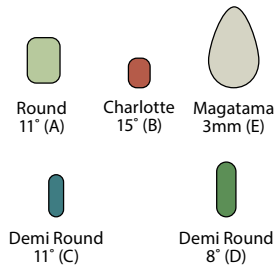
# Doubleloon Rope

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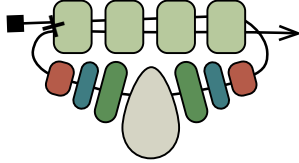
## SUPPLIES:

10gm TOHO Round 11° 2632F (A)  
5gm TOHO Charlotte 15° 222 (B)  
10gm TOHO Demi Round 11° 706 (C)  
12gm TOHO Demi Round 8° 506 (D)  
10gm TOHO Magatama 3mm 711 (E)  
TOHO One-G Thread  
2 Bead Caps  
Clasp of Choice  
*Makes a 16" rope before clasps.*

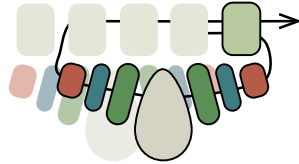


## DIRECTIONS:

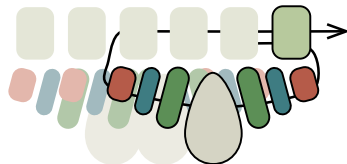
1. Add a stop bead to 2yd of thread. Add four A beads. The A beads will form the core of the spiral. Add B, C, D, E, D, C, B. Form a ring and tie a knot next to the first A. Pass through four A.



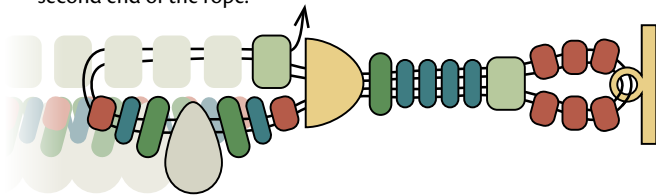
2. Add A, B, C, D, E, D, C, B. Keeping the new beads above the old, pass through the last four A beads in the core, including the A added in this step.



3. Repeat Step 2 until your rope reaches 16 inches, or your desired length.



4. To finish the rope, add a bead cap, D, four C, A, three B, clasp, three B. Pass back through A, four C, D, bead cap, B, C, D, E, D, C, B, and four A. Repeat the thread path before tying off. Repeat for the second end of the rope.
